After that is was smooth sailing for the Triumph however the day took its toll on us, we arrived safe but very tired and late into Katherine.

We quickly set up, put on some washing, showered then went to a dinner hosted by Shannon's Insurance & the Local Car Club.

Dad even received a special award for all the hardship he an Mum have overcome to make it to the Rally. Sorry there are not too many photos today.

It was just one of those days.

Tomorrow is a day off in Katherine, we really need the rest.

#### August 3, 2022 Day 17 - Katherine

Our morning off was filled with washing, book work, groceries & a doctors appointment for Mums Bee injection.

We then set off backtracking to Mataranka for a swim at Bitter Springs. It was well worth the 2hr round trip. Mum bought some pool noodles for us all and we floated around and relaxed our tired bodies in the 34° water.

The ant hills are enormous and we sighted our second blue tree.

Our Campsite is lovely and so shady. It is filled with gum trees. The showers and toilets were the cleanest I've seen in a while.

After dinner Dad & I went wandering around to to see if the shop was open for an ice cream. A man pulled up in his golf buggy and asked what we were looking for. We explained and he said jump in the buggy, I've got the keys to the shop I'll get you one.

So Dad set off back towards the Caravan, and I headed off in the dark, on a golf buggy, with a stranger and a promise of an ice team.

I was a little concerned when he said he needed to go home first to get the shop key, I had a quick 'Wolfe Creek' moment when we pulled up to his shack. BUT all was well, turns out he was the Park Owner and he was very kind & gave me two Magnums to take back to camp.

Today we head off for Timber Creek, no power tonight. Not sure if we will have phone service either. Fingers crossed for an easy day.

#### August 4, 2022 Day 18 - Katherine to Timber Creek

The drive today was stunning, the countryside changed from flat to mountains and over every hill we were amazed at how beautiful the next stretch of road was.

No troubles with the bike again, we just can't believe our luck. It just keeps going & going. Dad is going well, only complaining of a sore bum on the last leg of each day.

The lunch stop was at Victoria Creek Roadhouse, it looked like a great place to stay overnight. The Creek was beautiful, and the roadhouse was in a valley surrounded by huge red cliff faces. There were helicopter tours available, I'd we had the time I would have loved to have done it.

I took a quick bush walk down to the creek to get a photo and came across a huge pile of dung. We all agreed it must have been Buffalo Poo as it was about 40cm high

An hour later we were at Timber Creek.

Our camp site for the night was lovely and backed onto the creek where a resident Croc lives. Tomorrow, we set off for Kununurra where we have another rest day.

#### August 5, 2022 Day 19 - Timber Creek to Kununurra

We left a little earlier today as it's getting too hot for Dad & the bike after midday.

No one in the Caravan Park got a sleep in today!

I managed to get a video of Michael's run & jump start; he is so limber. Very impressive, considering he has broken his back at least 3 times.

The Boab Trees between Timber Creek & Kununurra were enormous. I'm disappointed that I couldn't find a safe place to pull over to photograph them.

There was a big congregation at the last stop before the border where we ate all our fruit and veggies as we weren't allowed to take them into WA.

At the Border the car & van was searched and 30km later we were at Kunanurra.

Our campsite is on a beautiful lake where we have a view of the 'Sleeping Buddha'. We are here for two nights. Tomorrow, we have a day off. We are taking a flight in a fixed wing plane over the Bungle Bungles, I can't wait

#### August 6, 2022 Day 20 - Kununurra

Our morning started very early when Dad woke us thinking we had all sleep in. Trouble was Dad's clock hadn't changed time zones. It was in fact 5.30am, not 7.30am

At 9.30 we set off on our flight over the Bungle Bungles, Lake Argyle & The Argyle Diamond Mine. The two-hour tour and commentary were phenomenal. Something I would recommend and do again. The bike had a major service this afternoon as Dad was a little concerned about a few noises it was making. The tappets were adjusted, and the bike appears to be running well. Tomorrow we will try and leave earlier again so the bike isn't getting too hot in the middle of the day. Our evening was finished off perfectly with a hamburger by the lake.

Day 22 - On the Road to free camp at Mary Pool Rest Area

#### August 8, 2022 Day 22 - Warmun to Mary Pool Rest Area

Off we set, bright and early for our 272km day to Mary Pool Rest Area. We bypassed our scheduled stop of Halls Creek on the recommendation of fellow travellers due to an increase in local crime. Mum and I were lucky to see a dingo in the wild today. It ran straight across the road in front of us. He stopped on the other side of the road and looked back at us, it really was amazing.

The bike travelled well most of the day. On the second fuel stop we noticed two worn patches on the tread of front tyre.

The bike also started losing power on the last 5km. So as soon as we pulled in & set up we changed the tyre & adjusted the grado clutch mounting plate. Everything else appears to be going well. Mary Pool Rest Area is quite large and covered in huge Gum Trees. There are Brahman cows with calves wandering all through the camp area. The Pool was almost empty, although cool and slightly inviting due the 35° heat no one was game to get in.

We are very fortunate to be travelling closely with Sabina & Michael and Sally & Andrew. They saved a camp spot for us today and let us use their shower tonight

We have another long day tomorrow as we set off for our second free camp. There is nowhere safe to stay in the Fitzroy Crossing. The Caravan Park is closed for two days due to a government booking. Ellendale Station Rest Area appears to be our only choice.

#### August 9, 2022 Day 23 - Mary Pool to Ellendale Rest Area

We woke quite early this morning, 3.30am, to the sound of rain. It only lasted no more than 30 seconds, but it was enough to have everyone up and scrambling to move items under cover.

No one really got back to sleep after that. We said good to the cows at 6.20am and headed for our next free camp at Ellendale Station Rest Area, 268km south.

We stopped quickly at Fitzroy crossing for water and fuel. All the locals were very intrigued by the bikes and had lots of questions.

We got word that Fitzroy Crossing had opened some powered camp sites BUT the boys decided that it was too early to stop for the day, so on we drove on to our roadside campsite.

Ellendale Rest Area is not too bad, we only have one working drop toilet but at least it doesn't smell like the last one plus we have road base under foot tonight instead of red dust.

The bike lives to ride again tomorrow. It did run a low on power today, only sitting comfortably around 50km/hr where it was previously motoring quite comfortably at 60km/hour. There was more tinkering this afternoon and we have our fingers crossed it's back up to speed tomorrow.

Our last scheduled stop before Broome was meant to be Willare. Unfortunately, the Caravan Park won't take bookings and there is only 21 powered sites.

After 2 days of free camping, the girls are all keen for a swim, a shower & some electricity. Lucky for us a short 30km detour has us in Derby on a powered site. This will be our first sighting of the coastline since we left QLD mid-July.

We are all looking toward to some Chinese takeaway and hopefully a Sea Breeze.

#### August 10, 2022 Day 24 - Ellendale Rest Area to Derby

Another early rise at 5.30am to get Dad on the road before it was too hot.

We had an easy ride of 170km into Derby. Only needed one fuel stop on the way.

We ended up with a convoy coming into Derby. There was no opportunity for over taking and we caught up to the boys earlier than expected. It looked like Dad was getting escorted into Town. Dad, Michael & Andrew were in the lead, followed by Sabina towing her Caravan, sally in her Wine-

bago, a Road Train, Mum & I with our Caravan and at least two more vehicles behind us towing Caravans. All doing 55km/hr for the last 10km into Derby.

We set up camp quickly, got some washing done and were at the Pub ready for lunch by 11.45. The problem was it didn't open until 12noon

I was fortunate to catch up with my old neighbours Chris & Barry who have been travelling around Australia for the last year. Such a coincidence that we were in Derby on the same day.

The boy's road the bikes over to the Jetty on sunset for some great photos. I got very teary when I saw the ocean.

The Jetty & the Sunset was stunning as was the local Artwork.

Tomorrow is our last day of the Rally, 255km to Broome.

#### August 11, 2022 Day 25 - Derby to Broome

It was the last day of the Rally today and I am pleased to say it was smooth riding for Dad and his Motorbike. He can now say he has Triumphed across Australia all 4,862 Kilometres!

He was the oldest rider on the rally and am so proud of him, such a huge achievement.

It has been a long 25 days of early starts, driving & setting up for the night, on repeat. BUT I would do it again in a heartbeat.

I have seen parts of Australia I didn't know existed, countryside and colours I couldn't imagine and people I will never forget.

The support and camaraderie among the riders, drivers & support crew has been amazing.

We are in Broome for a week and looking forward to being a tourist.

Thank you for to my family and friends who have followed us on this journey. Your encouragement and support have been wonderful.
